

CONGENITAL DEFORMITIES CAN BE CURED!

Child born with Bilateral Club feet (CTEV)

Started serial casting (every week) to correct the deformity by Ponseti method. Followed by both sides Tendo Achilles Tenotomy and final cast for 3 weeks.



Results are fully corrected feet. Patient is given Denis Brown splint for maintaining the correction and to prevent the relapse of deformity.

Congenital Talipes Equino Varus (CTEV) also known as clubfoot deformity is seen in 1 in 1000 live births. Child is born with foot turned inwards and downwards. It can be a due to intra uterine position or part of other syndrome. Treatment is started immediately after birth in the form of corrective plasters changed every week, followed by Tendo Achilles Tenotomy.
